Entry:

There is no entry fee required for submissions. Participants need not be enrolled in gifted programs. By submitting your work, you agree to the Terms and Conditions of the event as stated herein. All work submitted must be original material written by the participant and is the sole responsibility of the participant. Participants are entirely responsible for all content submitted, and such content must (i) not be an infringement of any copyright or trademark; (ii) not be a violation of the privacy, publicity or other proprietary rights of any person or entity; (iii) not be a solicitation or advertisement; (iv) not contain any private or personally-identifiable information belonging to you (except for your own name, school name, and address) or to any non-fictional third party or entity; (v) not be obscene, sexually explicit, indecent or gratuitously violent; (vi) not be unlawful, fraudulent or harmful, defamatory, harassing or intimidating; and (vii) not be in violation of any of the terms and conditions contained herein.

But no more than one entry in each category will be accepted; i.e. one poem per poet, one story per author. If more than one entry per category is submitted, all entries in that category by said writer will be disqualified.** Please follow these additional instructions as follows:

Maximum submission length of 1250 words for stories;

- No submission length restrictions for poetry;
- Clearly state your name on a cover page;
- Clearly state your name in the upper right corner of each page of your submission;
- Attach the Application and Authorization forms to the front of your submission;
- Securely staple all pages of your submission together (unless emailed-please see below);
- Number all pages of your submission;
- All entries must be typed, double-spaced, in Times New Roman 12;
- Please copy your work as your submission will not be returned to you;
- Only your final draft will be accepted.

Deadlines:

We will begin accepting submissions on March 1, 2010. The deadline to submit an entry for the awards is August 2, 2010.

Overall Topic – Creativity Expressed in Writing

- Accepted Genres: Poetry and Stories
- Poetry Topics:
 - “The Celebration Of Life”
 - “What Do You See In Life And How Do You Respond To It?”
- Story Topics:
 - “Building Sand Castles”
 - “Crossing Out Mistakes”
 - “Listening For Smells”

- All students are eligible from the following groups (A, B, C), identified by the grade in which enrolled:

Group A: Grades 4 and 5
 Group B: Grades 6, 7, and 8
 Group C: Grades 9, 10, 11, and 12

Award Groups:

- One poetry winner will be selected from each grade group
- One poetry runner-up will be selected from each grade group
- One story winner will be selected from each grade group
- One story runner-up will be selected from each grade group
- One grand prize winner with the highest scoring submission of all grade groups and both genres will be selected.
- Judging shall be conducted by trained, certified judging volunteers through use of a points based scoring rubric. Components of said scoring rubric are:

Poetry:

 Originality
 Imagery

Stories:

Imagination
 Originality
 Elaboration
 Fluency

Prizes:

- One grade 4 and 5 (Group A) poetry winner will receive: creativity book and publication of submission.
- One grade 4 and 5 (Group A) poetry runner-up will receive: publication of submission.
- One grade 6, 7, and 8 (Group B) poetry winner will receive: creativity book and publication of submission.
- One grade 6, 7, and 8 (Group B) poetry runner-up will receive: publication of submission.
- One grade 9, 10, 11, and 12 (Group C) poetry winner will receive: creativity book, and publication of submission.

- One grade 9, 10, 11, and 12 (Group C) poetry runner-up will receive: publication of submission.
- One grade 4 and 5 (Group A) story winner will receive: creativity book and publication of submission.
- One grade 4 and 5 (Group A) story runner-up will receive: publication of submission.
- One grade 6, 7, and 8 (Group B) story winner will receive: creativity book and publication of submission.
- One grade 6, 7, and 8 (Group B) story runner-up will receive: publication of submission.
- One grade 9, 10, 11, 12 (Group C) story winner will receive: creativity book and publication of submission.
- One grade 9, 10, 11, 12 (Group C) story runner-up will receive: publication of submission.
- One Grand Prize Winner will receive: creativity book and publication of submission, plus NAGC Convention registration for the participant's teacher and NAGC Parent Membership for the participant's parent.

All award recipients will be notified on or about September 20, 2010, via telephone, email, and US Postal Service. The parent and teacher of the Grand Prize Winner will also be notified via telephone and US Postal Service. It is the responsibility of the participant to ensure their contact information is correct and current. No submission shall be accepted if the Application Form and Parental Consent Form are not attached thereto. No transfer or substitution of prizes is permitted, and no more than the stated number of prizes will be awarded. Travel expenses to the NAGC Conference are not included. Award recipients are solely responsible for all costs or expenses not specifically exempted herein, and any and all applicable federal, state, or local taxes on the value of their prizes. Poetry and stories submitted by the same participant may not be eligible for more than one prize.
